

## Year 7 English: Tell me a story

To begin term 1 Year 7 English worked through the Stepping Stones interdisciplinary unit to help them settle into high school. Students got to know other students and staff by answering questions and creating visual representations of themselves to communicate their hobbies and likes.





Students listened to personal recounts by people such as Dylan Alcott and Miranda Tapsell and discussed why people tell stories. By looking at key features of narratives including plot structure, setting and character students then created their own either personal or imaginative narrative. Students were encouraged to use feedback to edit and improve

their grammar skills.

To finish the unit students were tasked with taking a well-known character and creating a narrative using a visual storyboard. Students embraced this activity with many

The students of 802 have been exploring the different states of matter, and how different substances can transition between them. This included



some mad-scientist moments of degassing gaseous liquids, and attempting to evaporate milk by heating it. What the students learned is that some liquids will evaporate more easily than others, and that milk is *not* one of those liquids. Soft drink, with its carbonated,



gaseous, bubbles, is also a difficult liquid to evaporate. From here, students will be exploring this shape shifting in food and how it can be used to create the ultimate beverage: ice cream floats.
