Year 9 Geography

This term, class 902 has been investigating the production, sustainability and transportation of our food. With our preservice teacher Mikayla Curtis, students have identified and investigated the amount and intake of water for plant health, food miles of their favourite snacks and the significant percentage of food waste grocer's dispose of due to imperfection.



One of our key explorative topics was comparing the taste, texture and aesthetic between the Coles I'm Perfect, Wool-worths Odd Bunch, Drakes Save Food and the Uradila 1st grade Apples.



In addition to this activity, Students have viewed content on the War on Waste, short clips on the way people are saving money on groceries through dumpster diving, and the significant cost of foods that are just being thrown out by families, schools and major retailers.

In coming weeks, we hope to have the year 9's engage with a War on Waste movement here at school, recycling movement, and introducing a composting movement for organic waste.

We are excited to hear that Mikayla will be continuing here at SSC after her placement, having won a position as a Student Support Officer.

Chemical Science

Recently, the Year 8 and 9 students have been investigating chemical reactions as part of their science curriculum. As well as the theory of particles, matter and reactions the students have undertaken experiments to explore the differences between physical and chemical reactions, acids and alkalis and the pH scale.

Students enjoy the practical side of science and are fascinated to observe how different chemicals react together to produce a new product. At all times, safety is paramount and students have learned how to be safe with acids and alkalis and they now have a deeper understanding of the meaning of hazard signs on chemical bottles and how to handle them in a safe way.

As an extension of their work, the Year 9s were asked to write a newspaper report of an incident involving an acid tanker crash on a road near to where they live. Part of this literacy exercise was for the students to explain some of the actions the police and fire services would have taken.
