Brightpath

As part of our site improvement plan literacy focus to improve writing we have engaged with the Brightpath program. Brightpath is a Department for Education initiative that focuses on building student capacity through identifying teaching priorities. Twice a year students are asked to write to a prompt and the Brightpath ladder is used to identify strengths and areas for improvement that teachers then include in their planning. Springbank Secondary College began using this program last year and in this early phase we are developing our implementation, feedback and data analysis.

As part of the narrative writing capacity-building focus, 702 and some year 9 classes participated in a workshop on literary techniques to assist them in their creative writing. This workshop saw students make decisions, discuss reasoning and adjust thinking if needed. The SSC Brightpath team continue to undergo training and discussions with the DfE Brightpath team as we seek to strengthen our understanding and implementation of this program.



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Basketball Academy: Flinders University - Strength and Conditioning Screening Program

After completing their baseline testing last term and being provided with a 6-week strength and conditioning program, Basketball Academy students were tested at the end of October to measure their progress. The intention of fitness testing is to evaluate specific aspects of an athlete's physical condition so that training programs and performance goals can be set, applied and evaluated throughout the season.

This experience has provided students with the opportunity to evaluate their own progress as an athlete. The support and guidance from Flinders University has been fantastic and we look forward to working together again next year to support our students.

Basketball Academy students returned to Colonel Light Gardens Primary School this term. This provided an opportunity for our student to apply their knowledge and understanding in regards to providing a safe and engaging learning environment as the coach. SPEED LIMIT 10






Term 4 Aquatics






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












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Canteen Update

Reminder to all families: Materials & Services Charges are due for 2023. Families who may be entitled to school card benefits need to apply each year. Please note applications for the 2023 School Card Scheme close Friday 24 November 2023. Unpaid charges will be forwarded to the Fines Enforcement and Recovery Unit (FERU) within the Department of Treasury and Finance, which undertakes the recovery of materials and services charges on behalf of the DfE in accordance with their debt management processes.


