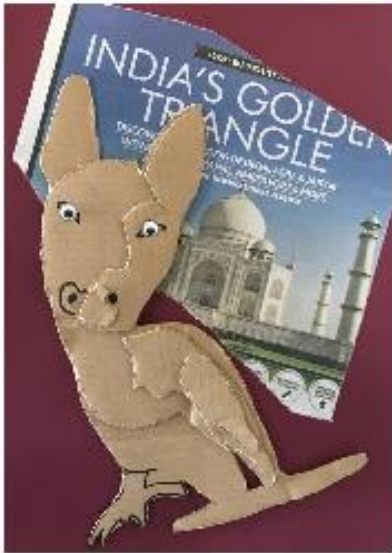

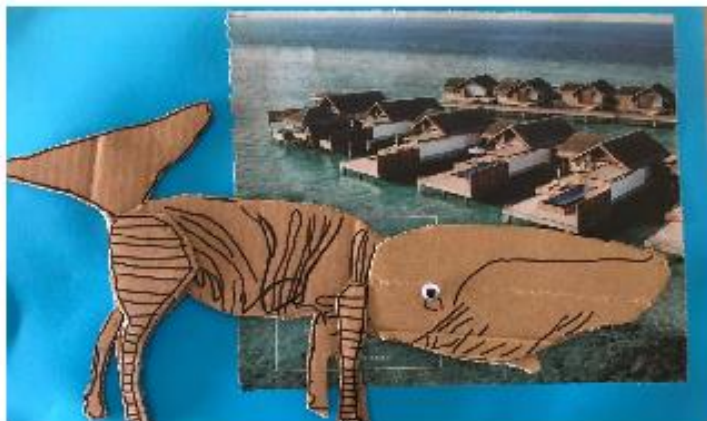


Year 12 ceremony and dinner
