## Year 8 Geology Art-STEAM project

After learning about different types of rocks and minerals in geological science, year 8 students participated in a STEAM project to finalise their science learning. They selected their favourite rock sample and used this as the basis to create their own art work.

Firstly, they observed their selection (acting) thinking like a geologist and sketched the shape of the rock and the shapes within it with the help of Art teacher Ms Zupancic. Then students researched the physical properties of their chosen rock and created a colour scheme in proportion to the colours of their selected rocks or crystals. They then created their own art work based on inspirations from practising artists who were inspired by geological science. In the end, students reflected on their final art work and all were very satisfied with their achievement.

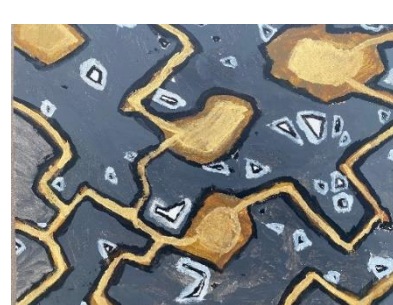
Thanks to Ms Zupancic for providing this unforgettable art experience. The students appreciated the support they received to develop their art skills in the context of science.

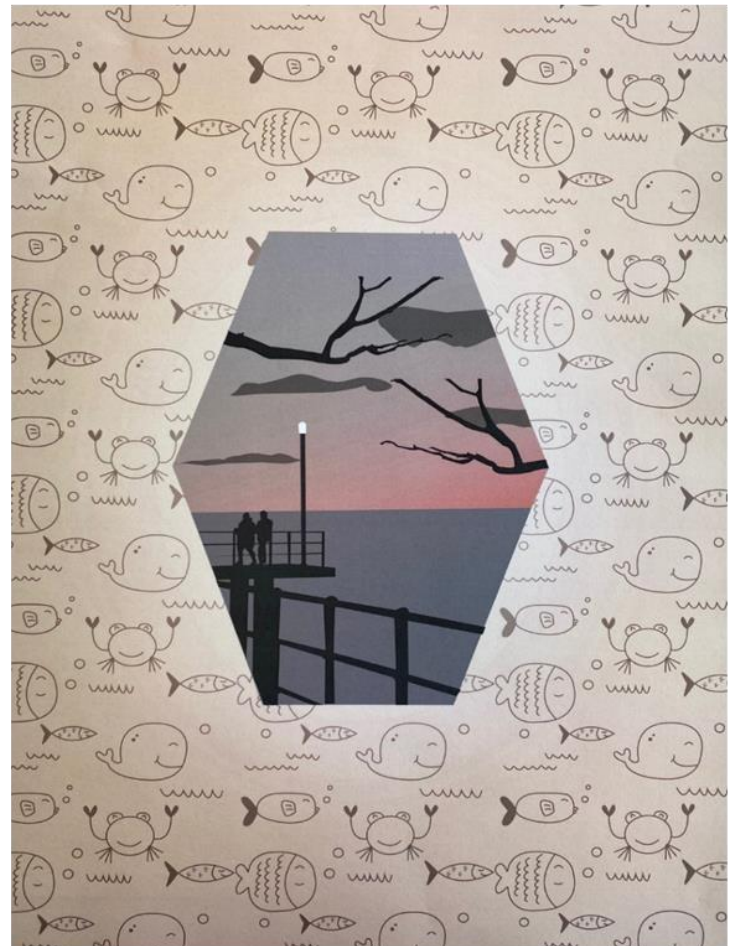
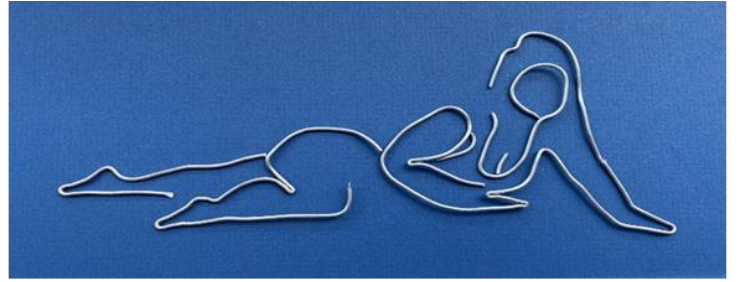




# Year 11 Visual Art
