## Ice Factor - Term 1

## Year 9 Science Urrbrae Wetland Excursion

After learning about the theory of biological science, year 9 students had the opportunity to visit Urrbrae Wetland on Tuesday, week 7, term 1. Students were instructed to collect four different water samples and measure their oxygen level, temperature, turbidity and pH for comparison. Based on the results collected, they were able to assess whether the Urrbrae Wetland does help clean up the storm water that runs out to the sea. Students noticed that oxygen and temperature increased as the water moved through the ponds while salinity, turbidity and pH decreased. They explored the reasons that caused these differences and the role of the water reeds that filter out the impurities and provide clearer water when transitioning from pond to pond.





Students also conducted their individual or group investigation on the types of macroinvertebrates living in this unique environment including aquatic insects such as Water Boatmen, Caddisfly and Water Fleas. Under the microscope, they took photographs of these microorganisms and made qualitative and quantitative observations on the aquatic animals they caught including insects, crustaceans and molluscs. It was a great experience for students to apply their theoretical understanding into a practice situation and experience nature.

Thanks to Mrs Thurlow and Ms Vanessa Greenslade from Urrbrae Wetland for organising this unforgettable ecology experience. The students appreciated the support they received to build up their knowledge of ecological science. This included the understanding of the importance of all aquatic macroinvertebrates in the wetland ecosystem with a number of hands on activities.
