Art in the Community

This semester, three art students (Kylie, Summer and Sophie) have successfully collaborated with the Mitcham City Council, community volunteers and local mural artist Tayla Carlaw to design and paint a mural for the Mitcham Railway Station.

The mural was a massive undertaking due to its size (4 metres in height and 3 metres in width) and took over 2 months to complete. The work stands as a memorial to Nellie Ellis and her garden which surrounds the Mitcham Railway Station.

The Garden was established in the 1950's and 60's by the Station Master, Bob Ellis for his wife Nellie Iris Ellis. Nellie suffered from agoraphobia and the garden provided a gateway for Nellie to make her way back into the world. Both Nellie's and Bob's ashes were buried in the garden. The garden is now maintained by a group of volunteers that meet weekly.

This was a great opportunity for the students to work under a practicing mural artist, learn about local history and give back to their community.




Simple steps to help stop the spread
