The Governing Council Annual General Meeting (AGM) was held online on Monday 14 March. Welcome and congratulations to the 2022 Council parent members including office bearers Danielle Duffield (Chairperson), Jody Moate (Deputy Chair), Erna Johns (Secretary), Damien Jackaman (Treasurer), Candice Page, Katie Nuttall and Jessica Loan.

The parents will work with the principal and the staff representative (Natasha Grundy) and ex-officio members Councillor Yvonne Todd (City of Mitcham) and Nadia Clancy MP (Member for Elder) to continue the governance of Springbank Secondary College.

Refurbishment of Springbank

The **Capital Works** program is well underway with the four floors of Phase one already gutted and initial fixings in place. Some delay has occurred while lead dust found in the ceiling was removed within strict DfE guidelines. Next week, during the holidays, the **site will be closed** while Building 5, next to the stadium, will be demolished. The site must be completely cleared (except for the builders and demolition crew) as there is some asbestos removal within the demolition.



As per my letter issued last Wednesday, Governing Council has approved the school takes on a loan \$1M from DfE to ensure that phase 2 of the Capital Works program (the science wing redevelopment) is completed. Skyrocketing costs of building resources and labour pushed the cost of Phase two beyond the original \$10M budget. Governing Council will support the school to seek funding to offset this loan.

Science news

YEAR 9 SCIENCE – LIGHT AND EYE DISSECTION

The Year 9 students have been busy in recent weeks exploring the science of light.

Students commenced this topic by exploring the various properties of light, including reflection and refraction. Using our light boxes, they could explore how light waves converge and diverge using different lenses. They also explored the nature of light and colour using a prism to split white light into the colours of the rainbow. Extension activities included the exploration of how light is seen in the natural world such as a blue sky, red sunset and the Aurora Australis.



This part of our curriculum culminated in the dissection of pigs' eyes to look at the anatomy of an eye and relate it to its function. Many students were nervous to commence this activity but once they recovered from their initial shock of observing a mammalian body part most enjoyed this learning activity. Others could participate from a distance using YouTube as their tool to investigate this subject.

Unit Science – Putpa Garden

Maintenance of the Putpa Garden

Whilst the weather remained pleasant the Unit Science students wanted to undertake some gardening and maintenance work in our Putpa Garden.

For many students they noticed that many of the plants had grown over the spring and early summer and were beginning to look straggly and unkept. The grasses had quadrupled in size and needed a cut back to remove the dead seed heads. The trailing vine lilac looked spindly and had some dead wood and some weeds needed removing.

With the support of Mr Brett Richards, the school's groundsman, the students spent a lesson pruning, pulling, trimming and digging.



Following instruction from Mr Richards, Zanden learnt how to use a hedge trimmer safely and accurately and spent his time trimming the grasses and overgrown bushes.

Tyson and Jordan topped up the two dry creek beds with new gravel and Jake helped to cut back and remove some weeds.

With the cooler and wetter months approaching the students plan to plant some more ground cover. The Pigface plants have always done well in this garden and the students will be research different local varieties of Pigface to purchase and plant. We are grateful to Mrs Jody Moate who has offered some Running Postman and Scurf Peas which we can plant out in the Spring.
